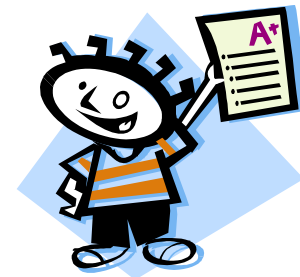

Seniors who need mid-year grades sent to Michigan colleges should use Parchment.com. The student should first select the college(s) needing mid-year grades. Next, the student should select the second option "Next Grading Period Transcript". The Guidance Office will send mid-year transcripts when they become available in early February.

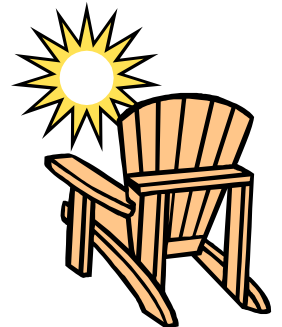
